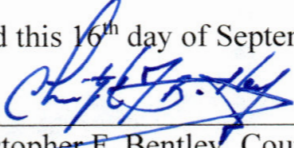
EXECUTIVE SESSION — CONSULTATION WITH ATTORNEY; REAL PROPERTY

To convene a closed meeting pursuant to Texas Government Code Sections 551.071 and 551.072 to consult with legal counsel for the County regarding: 1) potential or contemplated litigation or on a matter in which the duty of the attorney to the governmental body under the Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct of the State Bar of Texas clearly conflicts with Chapter 551 and 2) to discuss the purchase, sale, exchange, lease, use, or other disposition of real property because deliberation in an open meeting would have a detrimental effect on the ability of the County to negotiate with a third party.
